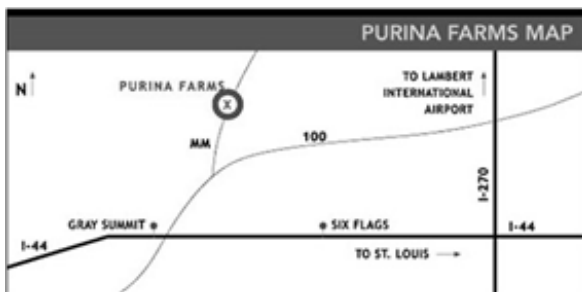

Purina Farms instituted a mask requirement on July 26. Points For Reserve

The BORDER COLLIE SOCIETY OF AMERICA will award at its National Specialty a three point major to Reserve Winner's Dog if the Regular Class Dog entry is twice the required number for a five point major in the division where the 2021 National Specialty is held.

The BORDER COLLIE SOCIETY OF AMERICA will award at its National Specialty a three point major to Reserve Winner's Bitch if the Regular Class Bitch entry is twice the required number for a five point major in the division where the 2020 National Specialty is held.

THE AKC NATIONAL OWNER HANDLED SERIES

The AKC National Owner-Handled Series is a non-titling competition for dogs that are exhibited by their owners that are not professional handlers. Exhibitors must declare their dog is Owner-Handled eligible at the time of entry on the entry form. Dogs entered in the Amateur-Owner-Handler class will automatically be marked as eligible to compete in the NOHS. Eligible dogs will be identified by an asterisk in the judge's book, steward's book & the catalog. Professional handlers,* household members and current assistants to professional handlers** may not exhibit. Dogs must be handled by an eligible owner/handler for the AKC NOHS throughout the breed level (all classes, Winners, and Best of Breed) competition. Owner-Handled Best of Breed will be selected from the dogs that are eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition including Winners Dog, Winners Bitch and winners of the non-regular classes.

**Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years*

***A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis, or assisting a professional handler at the show or any time during the cluster/weekend. Current assistants that are eligible to compete in Junior Showmanship (meet age & amateur status requirements) may participate in NOHS.*

4-6 MONTH BEGINNER PUPPY COMPETITION - 2021 National Specialty Show only

One combined class will be offered for breeds of dogs that are (4) four months & under (6) six months on the day of the event. An AKC registration number or AKC litter number will be required for all entries. A foreign-born dog may enter this class if they are registered in the country of origin.

Dogs are required to be vaccinated (including rabies) in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol in order to avoid inadvertent transmission of illness by/to puppies not yet fully immunized. Dogs that are owned or co-owned by a professional handler may compete in this class, but must be handled by a non-professional handler. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants or household members of a professional handler. A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis, or assisting a professional handler at the show, or any show during a cluster/weekend.

AKC Rules in Dealing with Misconduct will be applicable to any person and dog entered at this competition. All applicable rules found in Rules Applying to Dog Shows will govern the conduct of this competition unless these regulations state otherwise. Exhibitors should plan on opening the mouth of their puppy for the judges. Breed standard disqualifications such as color, height, weight or dentition shall not be a point of consideration in the judging process for this Competition.

WINNERS

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs which according to their owner's records, have completed the requirements for a championship, but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of unconfirmed champions in Best of Breed Competition is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship. Select Dog and Select Bitch, where applicable, will be chosen immediately following Best of Breed competition. This will be followed by Best Owner-Handled.

Awards of Merit (Saturday - 7; Sunday - 5)

The judge may, at his or her discretion, recall into the ring those dogs and/or bitches from the total Best of Breed competition that the judge believes are worthy of final consideration for Best of Breed and present Awards of Merit to recognize the qualities of those animals.

Best Bred-By-Exhibitor Competition (Saturday)

For winners of the Bred-By-Exhibitor Dog and Bitch classes.

Best Veteran Competition (Saturday & Sunday)

For winners of the Veteran Dog and Bitch classes.

Non-Regular Classes

Involving single dog entries (eligible for Best of Breed)

(Classes provided for Dogs & Bitches)

Veteran Class - For Dogs or Bitches, 7 years of age or older on the day of the show. Champions may compete, if they are within the age limits. Neutered dogs and spayed bitches are eligible for entry in Veteran Classes. This class is offered at both specialties (2021 & 2020 National).

Veteran 7 years & Under 10 years • Veteran 10 years & Over

(2021 National Specialty Only)

Herding Titled Champion Class - For Dogs or Bitches that have earned an AKC Championship and an AKC herding title. The following titles do not apply: Instinct Test certificate and any other non-AKC title. This class is offered only at the National Specialty (Saturday).

Herding Titled Class – For dogs or Bitches that have earned an AKC herding title. The following titles do not apply: Instinct test certificate and any other non-AKC title. This class is offered only at the National Specialty (Saturday).

Any undefeated dogs that have competed at the show only in additional non-regular classes may compete for Best of Breed. AKC champions of record may be entered in these classes.

Non-Regular Classes

(Involving Multiple Dog Entries, 2021 National Specialty Only)

Stud Dog Class - is for Stud Dogs and at least two (2) but no more than four (4) of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The Stud Dog cannot be shown as the Get for another Stud Dog. Owner of Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of Get. Offspring only to be judged based on their merits. Each dog making up the Get must be individually entered in one of the Regular Conformation Classes, Best of Breed Competition or a Non-Regular Conformation Class (other than the Stud Dog Class) at this show.

Brood Bitch Class - same as for Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get where appropriate.

A castrated male may be entered as the Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as the Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class.

As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog and Brood Bitch Classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, none of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE CLASS: This shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have 10 Best Junior wins with competition.

NOVICE AND OPEN CLASS DIVIDED: **Junior**-9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show; **Intermediate**-12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show; **Senior**-15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

After the judge has awarded the Best Junior Handler, the second place winner from the class that the Junior was awarded Best Junior Handler is to return to the ring to compete for Reserve Best Junior Handler.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department, 919-233-9767. BE SURE ALL INFORMATION for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of entry form.

NOTE: SUBSTITUTION OF DOG IN JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP AT THE SHOW(S): There will be an Administration Fee of \$5.00 charged for any substitution of dog in Junior Showmanship at each show. In addition, if the dog originally entered in Jr. Showmanship was an additional entry, and the dog being substituted is not otherwise entered in the show, the Junior Showmanship Only fee applies.

** Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present or Best Junior Handler (from a Novice Class with competition present after closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one-half hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show.

The Superintendent must receive written notification by letter hand-delivered, emailed, or postmarked at least 30 minutes before the trial commences.

SPECIAL EVENTS

JANET LARSEN VERSATILITY AWARD

The Janet Larson Award recognizes the dog that exemplifies true versatility by successfully competing in herding and performance competitions. Dogs must qualify in herding and two other venues. The new computation uses the actual scores rather than just qualifying status. This should result in superior performances being rewarded.

The highest scoring day from each venue will be the only day that counts for scoring. Obedience and rally have been combined into one venue since they utilize the same skills. Agility was pared down to just Standard and Jumpers with Weaves counting towards the score but the Premier classes were added. Herding is still the foundation with the most points available overall, and a score in herding is required to continue in the competition throughout the week. The test classes will no longer count towards the award, because they are pass/fail, there is no score to use in tabulation.

There will be a conformation evaluation for dogs to earn maximum points from conformation. Additional points can also be earned by entering either Working Dog Sweepstakes or the 2021 National show. This change will allow altered dogs to earn points in conformation. It will utilize the score sheet that was developed for the Top 20 award and dogs will be given a score based on the Border Collie standard. Two judges will score each dog and the scores will be averaged. The conformation evaluation will take place on Wednesday at 5 PM, or following the agility competition.

We will offer three awards – Gold, Silver and Bronze.

Participants MUST submit a form with their acquired points at the end of each day. You can get your forms from Lisa Pruka.

Entry fee will be \$15. You MUST be pre-registered to compete. To register, please go to the BCSA website to make payment. This competition is open to BCSA MEMBERS ONLY.

Building Hours Show Hours: 6 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Events

Center will be available to vendors at noon and exhibitors at 2 p.m. Tuesday, September 6, 2016.

Clean-up Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. This includes properly disposing of waste and using designated relief areas and the public x-pen area on the East side of the Gateway Hall for all elimination needs. Designated stations throughout the facility should be used appropriately (i.e. watering station should not be used for waste or other materials)

RV Lots RV Parking: Purina Farms charges a fee for camping. Please check the policies and reservation form on the BCSA website, and make your RV parking reservations through BCSA. RVs must be removed from the show site on Monday, September 12, 2016 by noon.

No reserved vehicle parking. Parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis. No spaces will be reserved or saved with traffic cones, ex-pens or any other equipment. Everyone must follow the instructions of the Grounds Committee.

All RV exhibitors are asked to check-in upon their arrival with a club member. Show grounds open at noon or 3p.m. on the designated set-up day for the event depending on what is reflected in the rental contract. Any RVs arriving before that time will have to park in an open spot in the overflow RV lot or at the Outdoor Agility Field. Quiet hours are from 11p.m. – 6a.m. No RVs may move during designated quiet hour.

Only cars (max of 2) affiliated with the RVs parked in the spots will be allowed to park in the same spot in the RV lot. Any cars not affiliated with the RVs in the spots will be asked to move or be towed at the owner's expense.

In case of a medical emergency in the RV lot in the evening or after hours, exhibitors needing medical attention should leave the lights on their RVs allowing the response team to easily identify the appropriate vehicle.

If you choose to grill near your camper, then please let the coals burn out overnight, bag them the next day and put them in a trash barrel. For safety reasons, no campfires are allowed on the property.

In case of inclement weather, see the inclement weather procedures section of the rules.

Vehicles Exhibitors may not bring or use motorized vehicles on the property unless a medical condition requires the use of one. Documentation must be presented upon request by Purina Farms staff. A club can rent motorized vehicles for Club use to help shuttle exhibitors around the property. Golf carts may not be parked on sidewalks.

Grooming 20 amps of electric service available per assigned space All grooming in The Great Hall must be on 4mil plastic that covers the floor. Please assess grooming tables to make sure they won't damage facility floors. Rubber caps for the tables are available if tables appear like they will damage the flooring. Exhibitors and handlers will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their crates.

All food and beverages Need to be purchased through the on-site food service and catering company.

No outside food or beverage, or outside food service/catering company, is allowed on the Purina Farms property (Unless Club receives written permission from Purina Farms management) Any violation will be reported to the AKC or the appropriate sanctioned organization/group of the event

Crating in The Great Hall is determined by the Club/Group/Organization hosting the event. It will not be dictated or enforced by Purina Farms. All crates must be on a solid type of matting that won't allow liquids or other substances to seep through on to the floor No crates are allowed to remain in the ring area or on surrounding grass areas overnight. Crates may remain in the attached grooming area but dogs MAY NOT. No gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside any building or within 100 feet of any tent in which this dog show is conducted.

Crating space will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any roped-off areas and allocate crate and grooming space, if necessary.

Dogs No dogs are allowed, except for service dogs: In the Checkerboard Café, on the second floor of the Purina Event Center (unless given prior permission) and in any restroom or human bathing area.

All dogs are required to be on-leash at Purina Farms at all times (except when crated or as required to be judged)

No swimming (dogs and people) allowed in any ponds on the property

No dogs should be left unattended in the off-leash exercise areas or the public outdoor x-pens around the property

Parking No parking is allowed in the following areas: Fire lanes, inside either Hall (No vehicles are allowed to drive inside either hall) or on the sidewalks leading into either Hall except where loading and unloading is designated. In addition, no driving is allowed on sidewalks.

Driving or parking on any grass at Purina Farms is prohibited.

All exhibitors must abide by the 15-minute unloading/loading parking time limit designated around the Purina Event Center

Supplies Duct tape may not be used in the building. Only painter’s tape and gaffer’s tape can be used on the floor and walls of the facility.

General No helium balloons in either Hall. Balloons can be used in the Founder’s Room for special events (with approval from the Director of Purina Farms). No glitter or confetti allowed in the facility.

Alcohol may not be brought to the Purina Farms Visitor Center. Any exceptions need to be preapproved by Purina Farms management. Purina Farms is a “family friendly” property and public intoxication is prohibited. No exercise pens allowed around the front and back of the Purina Event Center or the grassy area adjacent to the East side of the Gateway Hall. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times, when on the grounds (including the Purina Farms Visitor Center and especially on the balcony at the Purina Event Center).

Exhibitors accept personal liability with respect to any claim made in respect to any damage or injury caused by their dog/s or dogs in their possession.

No selling of puppies or dogs on the premises. Smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes, is prohibited in buildings. No hunting, tent camping or swimming is allowed.

Weapons of any kind, illegal drugs and fireworks are not permitted on the premises.

Special Notes: Purina Event Center staff reserves the right to refuse entry to any party/person or animal and retains the right to remove any person or persons and/or any animal from the premises in order to ensure the safety of any and all visitors, including dogs and cats. Exhibitors indemnify Purina, the affiliated person/s or businesses conducting the event, against any and all claims of arising that may be leveled against them, jointly or severally, in respect to any damage, injury or loss to persons, pets and/or property.

Inclement Weather In the event a severe weather or tornado warning is issued for the immediate area, Site Security will notify the Purina Farms management team. The team will notify guests, participants and exhibitors of an impending weather event via the public address system and via the storm siren and announcements outside the building. Guests, visitors and exhibitors will be asked to seek cover in designated areas marked as severe weather shelter areas. Designated areas include the center hallway of the Purina Event Center, the inside wall of Gateway Hall and the South stairwell. After the weather event ends, Purina Farms management teams will announce all clear.

- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and/or Baray Events assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETENESS OF ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH ENTRANT.
- RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE. BaRay Events will add a \$30.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. - Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- LOSS OR DAMAGE – The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Additionally, clubs should include any specific local health requirements; for example proof of rabies vaccination.
- PUBLICATION RIGHTS – By entering this show, all owners, handlers, breeders and kennels agree that all rights to televise, videotape, photograph, advertise, promote and publicize or otherwise exploit this show, or the persons or animals participating in it or the results of the competition before, during or after the event, shall belong solely to The American Kennel Club and their respective assigns, including the use of the names, likenesses or biographical matter of all dogs, owners, handlers, breeders and kennels participating in the show and no such owner, handler, breeder or kennel shall allow any other party to make commercial use of any videotape or photograph of any person or animal participating in this competition.
