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NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS - ALL EVENTS

The American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations will govern this Show and Exhibitors must make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this Show Premium List. The American Kennel Club will collect the following at every Licensed or Member club event: An AKC

Recording and Service Fee of \$4.50 for each entry. An AKC Event Service Fee of \$3.00 per entry will be required for each dog entered at any 4 & Under 6 Months Puppy and Open Show. All Recording and Event Service Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club. (There is no Recording Fee or Event Service Fee for Junior Showmanship, Sweepstakes, Futurities, Brace/Team, Multi-Dog Classes, or Special Attractions.)

- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and/or Baray Events assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETENESS OF ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH ENTRANT.
- RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE. BaRay Events will add a \$30.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. The exhibitor will be contacted & required to send a money order for the original amount PLUS the \$30.00 NSF fee. Subsequent returned checks from same person may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY BASIS.
- REFUNDS for cancellations due to judge change or cancellations made prior to entries closing will be mailed by the Club to said Exhibitor or Agent AFTER THE SHOW. An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from all refunds for entries cancelled prior to the closing of entries.
- Females in season are not permitted to compete in Obedience or Rally Trials. If a female is withdrawn from competition because it came into season and the Superintendent is notified no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class in the trial, the Club is required to refund the entry fee. The Clubs may retain a processing fee and must publish this information in the premium. Clubs may determine the documentation, if any that is required to confirm the female is in season. This shall be stated in the premium. Note: No fee is paid to the AKC for females in season who are withdrawn.
- FAX ENTRIES – Fax entries will not be accepted.
- Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. There is no refund for DUPLICATE ENTRIES or OVERPAYMENTS. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the Show NO REFUND will be made. To find out about any AKC event cancellations call the AKC Event Cancellation Hotline 877-252-3229.
- Please note: Any hotel or motel listed in the premium list is subject to Event Committee Rules. We expect our exhibitors to be responsible guests. A report that an exhibitor at this show has abused hotel or motel property during this weekend may result in disciplinary action. Clubs reserve the right to decline future entries from the offending party in accordance with the provisions of Ch. 11, Sec. 15 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.
- Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- LOSS OR DAMAGE – The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Additionally, clubs should include any specific local health requirements; for example proof of rabies vaccination.
- PUBLICATION RIGHTS – By entering this show, all owners, handlers, breeders and kennels agree that all rights to televise, videotape, photograph, advertise, promote and publicize or otherwise exploit this show, or the persons or animals participating in it or the results of the competition before, during or after the event, shall belong solely to The American Kennel Club and their respective assigns, including the use of the names, likenesses or biographical matter of all dogs, owners, handlers, breeders and kennels participating in the show and no such owner, handler, breeder or kennel shall allow any other party to make commercial use of any videotape or photograph of any person or animal participating in this competition.

USE OF RAMPS – HOUND BREEDS

A judge requesting the use of a ramp must give notice to the show superintendent/show secretary prior to judging. AKC approval is not required. The entire entry in a breed is to be examined in the same manner (ground, table, or ramp).

At the discretion of the judge, the following breeds may be judged on the ground or on a ramp through all levels of competition: Grand Basset Griffon Vendeen, Norwegian Elkhound, Whippet, Norrbottenspets (Misc.).

The following breed must be judged on a ramp through all levels of competition: Basset Hounds and Cirneco dell'Etnas.

This policy includes Group, BIS, Junior Showmanship, the 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy Competition, the AKC National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS), and all other special attractions that offer Group and BIS competitions. Ramps can be used in emergency situation to judge any breed.

In an emergency situation, where use of a ramp is not indicated in the premium list, an exhibitor has the option of withdrawing their entry and receiving a refund. For the judging of juniors the ramp may be used at the discretion of the judge for the ramp optional breeds. (01/2026)

ADDITIONAL RULES - EXHIBITOR CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY

The HAWAIIAN HOUND ASSOCIATION reserves the right, without liability, to decline entries for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness, failure of its owner or owner's agent(s) to keep said dog under control, or any other cause. No one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or official acting in his/her capacity.

EXHIBITORS are charged with absolute responsibility for the control of their dogs throughout the period the dogs are on the show grounds including the rings, grooming areas and common areas. NO DELEGATION OF SUCH DUTY OF CONTROL GIVEN TO ANOTHER SHALL RELIEVE THE EXHIBITOR OF THE ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY TO CONTROL HIS OR HER DOG'S BEHAVIOR. As used herein, "control" shall require the Exhibitor to take such prudent affirmative action and effort as may be necessary to preclude the exhibitor's dog(s) from demonstrating against or evidencing aggressive behavior toward, or attacking or biting, or threatening to attack, or bite, any other Exhibitor dog, member of the public or show official. Exhibitors are especially reminded and CAUTIONED that dog show patrons, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN, whether or not accompanied by an adult, may be unaware that innocent touching or petting of a dog may be perceived as a threat by the dog, leading to its defensive behavior. It is incumbent upon the Exhibitor to include giving preventive warnings to all who may approach the dog(s) in a manner that is likely to incite unwanted behavior from the dog(s). Such warnings DO NOT RELIEVE the exhibitor of his or her continued duty to control the dog(s) at all times.

ALL DOGS PRESENT FOR EXHIBITION AT THIS SHOW MUST be held on leash or confined to their pens/crates. In furtherance of the foregoing, Exhibitors shall promptly and affirmatively respond to all instructions of any Show Official. Debate or argument with said officials is not permitted. While these rules are intended to prevent incidents from occurring, the inadequacy of any of these rules or regulations to accomplish this purpose does NOT release the Exhibitor from the "DUTY OF CONTROL" over his or her dog(s). Prudent action and prevention are expected and required of all exhibitors.

AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTERING DOGS

Turn to CLASSIFICATION on page 5 and select the class or classes for which your dog is eligible, then fill in entry form completely. The Open Classes will not be divided.

PLEASE enter information on PDF fillable form OR handwritten using all CAPS on entry form as the HHA assumes no liability for incomplete, illegible or incorrect information on the entry form.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of a dispute over the meaning or interpretation of any of these rules and regulations or compliance therewith, an Exhibitor shall make application promptly to the Show Chairman or member of the Show Committee for a hearing of the dispute by the Show Committee. The decision of the Show Committee shall be final, subject only to appeal to the American Kennel Club in the manner and pursuant to the procedure for appeals allowed by such a Club.

CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELF

The show site is next to a public school. Be sure all animal droppings are picked up and bagged using proper disposal. Please keep set-up areas clean of food, animal hair, cigarette butts and food containers. Exhibitors are expected to leave the grooming and holding areas clean, and to dispose of trash in the receptacles and bins. NO SET-UPS are allowed on school premises.

BRING SHADE AND WATER

THERE IS LIMITED SHADE under the trees. Exhibitors should bring shade and water for humans and hounds. ONLY DOGS REGULARLY ENTERED IN THIS SHOW WILL BE ALLOWED WITHIN THE SHOW AREA. All exhibitor set-ups should be a minimum of 10 linear feet from the ring and all entrance/exits to the ring should be unobstructed. Generators must be a minimum of 100 linear feet from the ring.

TROPHY FUND DONATIONS

Trophy Fund donations will be accepted, and all donations received by 8/26/26 will be acknowledged in the SHOW CATALOG. Send donations to HHA Show Secretary made payable to the Hawaiian Hound Association.

ENTRY SUBMISSIONS, CANCELLATIONS, CHANGES, TRANSFERS

CANADIANS make all entry fees payable in U.S. funds.
